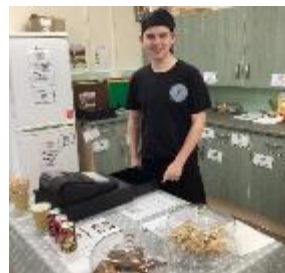
Upper School
